## 11<sup>th</sup> April 2019: Implementation of the All-Ireland Pollinator Plan by Councils

## Follow-up actions agreed

The All-Ireland Pollinator Plan team agree to:

- 1. Continue to engage with the Council sector through training and through another regional events in 2019.
- 2. More strongly encourage AIPP networks to be proactive in expressing their support to Councils who are adopting changes to management (longer grass, reduced herbicide use etc.)
- 3. Better promote advice and case studies from the Pesticide Action Network UK through the AIPP website
- 4. Profile positive actions being taken through short technical blogs and case studies. Make these available online to better facilitate knowledge sharing.
- 5. Pending owner's permission, put all presentations from the event online. <u>www.pollinators.ie/resources</u>
- 6. Add all agreed participants to an AIPP mailing list so that they can be kept up to date on developments.

Participants who attended the event can help by:

- 1. Personally taking at least one action to help pollinators in 2019
- 2. Telling someone new about the All-Ireland Pollinator Plan and how they can get involved
- 3. For those working within Councils, by encouraging their Local Authority to sign up as a partner of the AIPP.
- 4. Where relevant, by using the publicly available online mapping system (Actions for Pollinators <u>https://pollinators.biodiversityireland.ie/</u>) to show what action they have taken and to help track the build-up of resources within the landscape.
- 5. Helping promote the videos and the animation
- 6. Providing constructive advice to the AIPP team on any aspect of coordinating the implementation of the All-Ireland Pollinator Plan.
